Through targeted learning experiences, the program enhances the knowledge and skills needed to deliver high-quality care in rural settings.

PROGRAM TIMELINE

July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2027

Students gain hands-on experience and targeted instruction in emergency care, telehealth delivery, preceptor development, Montana-centered healthcare topics, and rural and mobile clinical placements..
