CDC: Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health



Montana REACH is rooted in practical values and local wisdom that make our communities strong. This work respects personal responsibility, family leadership, and community safety. For example, a new Produce Rx program with the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes includes work requirements to ensure participants are actively contributing while improving their health. In Fort Peck, wellness efforts prioritize the family as the foundation of a healthy community, emphasizing parental involvement and setting a strong example for the next generation. At Rocky Boy, initiatives to promote physical activity focus on public safety and protecting lives by reducing pedestrian accidents on local roads.

PROGRAM GOAL

Montana REACH is a five-year partnership where the Montana Office of Rural Health and AHEC works closely with the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes, Fort Peck Tribes, Rocky Boy, and Montana DPHHS to strengthen Native communities through practical, lasting solutions to reduce chronic disease. Montana REACH is specifically working in areas of Nutrition, Produce Rx, Physical Activity, and Family Wellness.
