

NURSING SIMULATION EDUCATION & TRAINING

HRSA: Nurse Education, Practice, Quality, and Retention (NEPQR)

The NEPQR-SET grant is intended to educate MSU Nursing students in the development of clinical skills, clinical reasoning, and real-world application of professional nursing skills. The program supports 16 of the 28 simulations integrated in the nursing curriculum to be enhanced with trained actors as patients or as embedded family members. This intentional resource builds communication skills, confidence, team work, and time management in the care of acutely ill patients. Enhanced simulations include cardiac, pediatric, obstetric, and mental health.

PROGRAM GOAL

Our goal is to provide high-quality simulation-based learning in a psychologically safe, controlled and standardized environment. Students can practice clinical skills, demonstrate competence, and develop clinical reasoning. Our overall goal is to ensure students are prepared to care for actual patients safely and with caring competence.

PROGRAM TIMELINE

CLINICAL PARTNERSHIPS

The NEPQR-SET grants foster community and clinical partnerships by providing simulation-based learning for nurse residency and clinical partners, addressing their educational needs. Community advisory boards facilitate open communication and feedback, enhancing the overall program.
