
## 2024-2025 Health Workforce Program Highlights

9,989 **AHEC Participants**  The Area Health Education Centers' (AHEC) mission is to enhance access to quality healthcare, particularly primary and preventive care, by improving the supply and distribution of healthcare professionals through community/academic educational partnerships.



#### **Clinical Training**

Clinical Training improves readiness, willingness, and ability of health professions trainees to serve in primary care, rural, and medically underserved community settings.





#### **Pathway Programs**

Pathway Programs (also known as Pipeline Programs) expose students to health careers and develop intent to pursue postsecondary education in primary healthcare professions.

**4,664**Health Career Participants

Programs include: Health Careers Enrichment Activities, Pre-Diploma/Certification Preparation, Summer Programs, After School Enrichment Activities, and Precollege Preparation.



## **AHEC Scholars**

AHEC Scholars is a program designed to prepare future health professionals with the leadership skills necessary to better serve vulnerable populations in rural and medically underserved communities.


